



Induction Program Description

Induction is a minimum 30 day introductory phase at MBTC. This is the first phase a student must complete in order to advance in the program. Students will be expected to meet all requirements before being able to graduate into phase one. The induction program is designed to be an intense daily routine with strict supervision. Induction Phase gives the student an opportunity to be free from all outside distractions and to focus on why they are here. Student will be on complete black out during there time in Induction. All personal business must be taken care of before entering the program or only after a student exits blackout. This includes: No visits, phone calls, mail, or probation/parole, and/or court dates. (Exception for emergency with permission by Program Director)

Induction students will have no contact with mission guest and limited contact with students in above phases. Induction students must stay within assigned boundaries at all times, failure to adhere to these regulations will result in the student choosing to leave. We are a open door policy, reminding students they are choosing to be here on their own accord and can choose to leave at any time. Induction is structured to challenge the student physically, mentally, and spiritually. All of this is in preparation for a new life in Christ, therefore we encourage each student to heed the words of Christ when he says “For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not sit down first and count the cost”(Luke 14:28) All men entering the program will hear the good news of Jesus Christ and be given the opportunity to accept Him as Savior and begin to allow Him to be Lord of their life as well. We desire that all men would come to know the Lord in a deep and personal way and as a result of fellowship with Jesus Christ they will embrace God’s promise “Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation, old things have passed away: behold, all things have become new” (II Cor. 5:17)

Requirements for Graduation:

- a. Spent a minimum of 30 days in program
- b. Completed all educational requirements
- c. Must pass drug, alcohol, and nicotine test
- d. Demonstrated a teachable spirit

- e. Demonstrated a willingness to lay aside all distractions that might hinder completion of the program and contain a potential to cause one to fall.
- f. Applied yourself to the class work to the best of your ability.
- g. Been faithful with work duties
- h. Demonstrated a sufficient amount of self-control of temper, giving the staff a reasonable hope for continued growth as a peacemaker in the future.

Rules and Policies

A. AREAS OFF LIMITS

- 1. All students must remain upstairs in induction center dorm
- 2. Mission Guest dorm is OFF LIMITS.
- 3. No students allowed in upstairs hallway or student rooms.
- 4. Front yard and Back yard are off limits unless supervised by staff.
- 5. Students only allowed downstairs for: meals, chapel, and supervised activities.

B. CHURCH SERVICES

- 1. Shirt and ties are required for Sunday service.
- 2. Induction students will attend services as a group. Students must stay together during service and must sit within the front five rows with supervisor.
- 3. No speaking with females at church events unless given permission by staff/supervisor.
- 4. Students must use the bathroom before or after service. There is no leaving to use the restroom or get water during service.
- 5. Students must remain within visual contact of supervisor at all times.
- 6. Extra involvement in church activities is not allowed until a student reaches the appropriate phase requirement.
- 7. Church is a privilege and should be treated as one.
- 8. Students must be ready for Sunday service by 8:30 am 5:45 pm on Wednesday nights.
- 9. Students are required to bring Bible to all church services.
- 10. The Sermon Note Sheet is to be completed and handed in for every service a student attends.

C. CLASSES

- 1. Students must attend all classes.

2. Students must work on assigned projects for each class session.
3. No Talking during assigned class times.
4. Students must use the restroom during break time only. NO LEAVING CLASS WITHOUT PERMISSION!
5. Students must be on time for all classes.

D. CONDUCT

Christ is the standard, so all behavior should strive to follow His example. Students are here to learn to be disciples or students of Jesus Christ; therefore all students are expected to “put off the old self, which is being corrupted by its evil desires, and to be made new in the attitude of your minds: and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness” (Eph. 4:22-24)

E. PERSONAL HYGIENE

1. Students must shower every day
2. Deodorant must be used daily
3. Teeth should be brushed twice a day
4. Clothing needs to be clean
5. Students must shave each morning
6. NO SHAVED HEADS!

F. WORK PROJECTS

Students will participate in assigned work projects. Students will be expected to work to the best of their ability with a positive attitude. All students will take part in work projects. Work projects are a requirement for all students and refusal to work is choosing to leave the program. (Students will not be asked to put themselves in danger or to take part in activities that may be harmful to their health or program)

Work Projects are designed to help students:

1. Learn to work with others
2. Experience the blessing of hard work
3. Practice submission to authority
4. Take initiative and learn responsibility
